ARC Rankings Explained

ARC is excited to continue ranking both teams and individuals for the 2020 race season.

How the ranking works...

Our rankings team (led by the amazing ARC statistician Ryan) uses four criteria to rank teams:

- 1. Teams are given points based on their finish rank for a race and the race length.
- 2. A Competition Factor (number of teams in your category) is created.
- 3. A Standard Distribution is used to even out the scores.
- 4. ARC compiles races from the last 365 days for each team of every race from which we have results.

ARC uses a set of rules to ensure as much equality in the ranking as possible.

- 1. Our goal is to incorporate all AR races where a US team is competing.
 - a. To be considered an AR race, the event must contain 2 different types of non-motorized travel and map/compass based navigation.
 - b. All results must be complete to be considered in ranking.
- 1. Up to seven racers per team for C-3/4, M-3/4, and F-3/4. All other divisions need exact team members.
- 2. Results from the past 365 days will be considered.
- 3. Rankings will be calculated the first week of each month/quarter.
- 4. Top 5 races by point count towards the ranking.
- 5. A tie in a race will result in splitting the 2 position points equally.
- 6. A team must request any team name change by email.
- 7. Adjustments to the equations can occur once a year in January as needed.

In order for teams to be accurately ranked, *race directors must pro*vide the raw data to ARC. If you raced and those race results have not been submitted to ARC, please contact the race director. All they need to do is email the race results to <u>results@arcooperative.org</u> and ARC will do the rest.

Region Coordinators

The ARC Board is reviving their Region Coordinator positions. We realize that in order to keep the race directors informed of the great work we are doing to support the AR community, we need Region Coordinators to keep us all connected.

Additionally, the Region Coordinators can give to the ARC Board much needed feedback from the race directors on their needs and requirements to be successful.

In an effort to even out the regions, the regions will be readjusted to reflect race series that already exist and combine areas that have fewer race companies.




Adventure Racing Statistics

For the past two years, ARC has been gathering data on adventure races around the country. We have more than 200 races and their data in our database. We are creating some very interesting statistical data from all this information.

Since January 2018, 6 and 12 hour races are the most common adventure race offered.



Additionally, the average winning time for an adventure race is 85% of the total length of the race.



We will keep crunching the numbers to give you more adventure racing stats.
